

The story of a collaboration of excellence, 100% French

The alliance between the Alpine brand and Barons de Rothschild is defined by the continuous search for exception. Armed with French know-how, they collaborate for the first time to promote strong common values.

Focused on a continuous search for excellence, they are combined under the sign of authenticity, elegance and exception. True symbols of refinement, Alpine and the Barons de Rothschild share the taste of exclusivity, both offering unique products.

Created in 1955 by Jean Rédélé, Alpine has established itself over the years with its French-style sports cars. Having become an icon of the sporting world, the brand produces innovative and exclusive cars. Alpine is now one of the leaders of car manufacturing know-how thanks to its perfect engineering skills.

Founded in 2005, Champagne Barons de Rothschild is a family and heart estate for the three branches of the Rothschild Family – today represented by Baron Philippe Sereys de Rothschild (Château Mouton Rothschild), Baronne Ariane de Rothschild (Château Clarke - Edmond de Rothschild Group), Baron Eric de Rothschild and his daughter Saskia de Rothschild (Château Lafite Rothschild).

Passionate about the most Grands Terroirs in France and the world, the three branches are joining forces for the first time in their history, in the creation of a common estate and develop together their unique interpretation of a Great Champagne Wine.



DOMAINES BARONS DE ROTHSCHILD LAFITE

The name Lafite comes from the Gascon language term "la hite", which means "hillock". There were probably already vineyards on the property at the time when the Ségur family organised the vineyard in the 17th century, and Lafite began to earn its reputation as a great winemaking estate. Jacques de Ségur was credited with the planting of the Lafite vineyard in the 1670s and in the early 1680s.

1868 - Baron James de Rothschild purchased Château Lafite, which had been placed under public sale through the inheritance of Ignace-Joseph Vanlerberghe. Baron James, who was head of the French branch of the Rothschild family, passed away just three months after purchasing Lafite. The estate then became the joint property of his three sons: Alphonse, Gustave and Edmond. The estate then boasted 74 hectares of vineyards.

1946 - A new generation of Rothschild became owner of Château Lafite Rothschild: Barons Guy, Alain, Elie, and Edmond. After a very difficult first half of the twentieth century and a second world war that leaves many wounds open, the mission to restore the smooth running of the domain is entrusted to Baron Elie de Rothschild.

1974 - The fifth generation of Rothschilds to lead Lafite, Baron Eric, nephew of Baron Elie, will be directly involved in the search for excellence at Lafite. He will also try to express the know-how of DBR(Lafite) in new territories by reviving castles and exceptional domains. This handover is welcomed by some fine vintages, 1975, 1976 and 1982 in particular. The property of Château Lafite Rothschild passes to the fifth family generation: Barons David, Edouard, Eric, Robert, Nathaniel and Benjamin de Rothschild.

2018 - The 30-year-old daughter of Baron Eric, Saskia de Rothschild, took over the reins of Domaine Barons de Rothschild in 2018 and represented the 6th family generation at the head of the wine estates.

DAY 1 | Friday 23rd June

11.15 AM - VISIT OF THE CELLARS


We propose a guided visit of the Castle's cellars. A wine tetsing will be held at the heart of the winery.

PROGRAM

DAY 1 | Friday 23rd June

The top start of the Alpine Route will be launched at 2.30pm! The crews will sail through the beautiful roads of the Médoc, the Silver Coast and the vineyards south of Bordeaux!

2.30 PM - 1st STAGE OF THE RALLYE - 135 kms

It is no coincidence that the Medoc is now a regional natural park. This prestigious French terroir wedged between an ocean and an estuary offers magnificent landscapes. We will walk the roads of the Gironde, cross the Garonne to enter a little more land and reach the Château Fage, located between Bordeaux and Saint-Emilion.

5 PM: ARRIVAL AT THE CHÂTEAU FAGE



12.30 PM: LUNCH AT THE CHÂTEAU PRIEURE MARQUET


This elegant chartreuse of the fifteenth will welcome you in an exceptional setting.


The Marquet table will make you discover the flavours of the South West terroir, paradise of French gastronomy.

REGULATION



ELIGIBLE VEHICULES

The ALPINE RALLY is strictly reserved for ALPINE road vehicles, whatever their models or years of construction.

List of eligible models: A106, A108, A110, A310 and its evolutions, A610, A110 new generation.

Years of production: 1955 to 2023.

Limited number of vehicles.

The selection committee reserves the right to refuse any vehicle.

Vehicles must comply with the French Highway Code.

Participants must ensure that their car is in good working condition, especially tyres, headlights, battery level and seat belts (if required by law).

Compliance with the vehicle traffic code is the responsibility of the participants. The organization will not conduct any technical, insurance or administrative inspections of the participants' vehicles and driving skills.

No change of registered participating vehicle is possible without prior authorization from RALLYSTORY.



ROAD STAGES

The program comprises three stages, namely 800 kms (500 miles) of rally routes.

Competitors must keep to the itinerary given in the road-book, there are no speed or average speed requirements. Competitors must have their route card signed at each Check Point (CP), the location of each are kept secret.

Please bear in mind that since the event is taking place on non-neutralized public highways, all participants must observe the Highway Code to the letter. Safety instructions are set out in the road book given to participants.

No speed notion nor average speed score will interfere into the final score classification.



ACCOMMODATION

At each stage, a special care is taken for accommodation to maintain the best comfort and the greatest conviviality between all participants.

SAINT-EMILION: 4 stars Hostel CHATEAU FAGE (www.chateaufage.com)

Accommodation in single bedrooms is possible, with supplement fee, according to availabilities.



COMMITMENT FEE

The commitment fee of €2,600 (€1,100 down payment on the commitment and €1,500 balance on departure) includes for a crew of two people and their vehicle: the logistic support, 1 night in room for 2 people with breakfasts, 3 meals with drinks from lunch from 23 June to lunch on 24, rally equipment (aluminium plates, door number, road-book...), gifts...

No commitment will be confirmed without a deposit.

If you cancel after May 30, 2023, the deposit will not be refunded.

INSURANCE

The ROUTE ALPINE is a leisure event aimed at bringing together owners of vintage or exceptional vehicles, outside of any notion of sport, speed, competition or race.

The owners of the vehicles engaged are personally responsible for the automobile liability insurance against third parties and for the insurance of damages that may be suffered by their vehicles. It is recommended that they check the extent of their coverage with their insurer before the test.

Vehicles operating on the road must comply with the Highway Traffic Act and, particularly, be equipped with a registration certificate, a technical inspection certificate (if required) in force and a valid certificate of insurance.

The participants waive the liability of RALLYSTORY in any capacity whatsoever, except in cases of gross negligence.

The contract concluded between the participants and the organizer, based on the French version, is governed by French law. Any dispute it might raise will be subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of Paris.
