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USER PRECAUTIONS (1/2)

It is essential to follow the precautions below when using the system, both in the interest of safety and to prevent material damage. You must always comply with the laws of the country in which you are travelling.



Precautions when operating the audio system

- Operate the controls (on the dash or near the steering wheel) and read the information on the screen only when road conditions allow.
- Set the volume to a reasonable level so that outside noise can be heard.

Precautions concerning the equipment

- Do not attempt to dismantle or modify the system, as there is a risk of damage to equipment and fire.
- Contact a representative of the manufacturer in the event of malfunction and for all operations involving disassembly.
- Do not use products containing alcohol and/or spray fluids on the area.

Precautions when using the phone

- There are laws which govern the use of phones in vehicles. They do not necessarily authorise the use of hands-free phone systems under all driving conditions: drivers must be in control of their vehicles at all times.
- Using a phone whilst driving is a significant distraction and risk factor during all stages of use (dialling, communicating, searching for a number in the handset memory, etc.).

Maintenance of the fascia

- Use a soft cloth and, if necessary, a small amount of soapy water. Rinse with a soft, slightly damp cloth, then dry with a soft, dry cloth.
- Do not press on the display on the front panel, and do not use any alcohol-based products.

Introduction

"R&Go" is an application that can be downloaded from your smartphone or tablet. This application lets you access several menus:

- "Navigation";
- "Multimedia";
- "Car";
- "Phone";
- "Calendar";
- "Settings".

Note:

- for further information on compatible phones and tablets, please contact an authorised dealer or visit the manufacturer's website if available;
- for further information on this application, please consult the section entitled **"R&GO**: general description".



Telephone holder

Depending on the equipment, you can keep your telephone activated on the centre console by using the "**R&Go**" application with the ergonomic equipment **1**.

Charging using the USB port

By connecting your telephone's USB plug to the USB port, you can charge or maintain the battery during use.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION (1/2)

Introduction

The audio system has the following functions:

- FM and AM radio;
- terrestrial digital radio (DR);
- USB auxiliary audio source management;
- Bluetooth® hands-free phone system.

Radio function

The radio can be used to listen to radio stations on the following bands: FM (frequency modulation) and AM (amplitude modulation).

The DR system (terrestrial digital radio in DAB, DAB+ and T-DMB format) provides better sound reproduction and access to "Radio text" text information which can be accessed by scrolling through the text to display:

- news updates;
- sports news;
- ...

The RDS system makes it possible to display the name of some stations or messages sent by FM stations to be displayed:

- general traffic information (TA);
- emergency messages.

Hands-free phone function

The Bluetooth® hands-free system provides the following features without having to handle your phone:

- pair up to five telephones;
- send/receive/reject a call;
- transfer the telephone or SIM card phonebook contact list (depending on the telephone);
- view the system call log (depending on the telephone);
- call voicemail.

Auxiliary audio function

You can listen to your portable digital audio player directly through your vehicle's speakers. There are several ways of connecting your portable audio player, depending on the type(s) of device you have:

- Bluetooth® connection;
- USB port.

For more information on the list of compatible devices, contact an authorised dealer.

Bluetooth® function

This function enables the audio system to recognise and operate your portable digital audio player or mobile telephone via Bluetooth® pairing.



Your hands-free telephone system is only intended to facilitate communication by reducing the risk factors, but does not remove them completely. Always comply with the laws of the country in which you are travelling.

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OPERATION (1/2)

Radio with central display

On and off

Press **1** briefly to switch on your audio system.

The audio system can be used with the vehicle ignition off. It will operate for several minutes. Press **1** to make it operational for a few additional minutes.

Switch off the audio system by pressing **1** briefly. The system only displays the time.

CHOOSING THE SOURCE

Scroll through the various audio sources by pressing **2** repeatedly. When scrolling, the audio sources appear in the following order: $FM \rightarrow DR \rightarrow AM \rightarrow USB \rightarrow Bluetooth$ [®].

You may also select the radio source by pressing **13** or **14**.

When you switch on your radio the media previously playing should resume, if not briefly press **2**.

When you connect a USB media source while the audio system is switched on then the source will automatically switch to the new media and start to play its content.

When you connect a Bluetooth® media source while the audio system is on, if the audio source playing was already Bluetooth® then the media content will switch and start to play automatically on the audio system.

Note: press 3 or 19 to display the telephone menu.

VOLUME

Adjust the volume by rotating **1** or by pressing **16** or **17**.

The display shows "Speed", followed by the current setting.



Mute

Simultaneously press *16* and *17*. The message "MUTE" is displayed on the screen.

Press **16** or **17** again briefly to continue listening to the current audio source.

You can also activate/deactivate the mute function by rotating **1**.

OPERATION (2/2)

Radio with display on the instrument panel

On and off

Briefly press **28** to switch on your audio system.

The audio system can be used with the vehicle ignition off. It will operate for several minutes. Briefly press **28** to make it operate a few additional minutes.

Switch off the audio system by pressing and holding **28**. The illustration shows the radio system display when stopped or in "Car" mode with the sound off.

CHOOSING THE SOURCE

Scroll through the various audio sources by pressing **24** or **25** repeatedly. When scrolling, the audio sources appear in the following order: $FM \rightarrow DR \rightarrow AM \rightarrow USB \rightarrow Bluetooth$.

You can also select the audio source from the audio menu. Press **32**, select the audio menu using **26**, **33** or **34** and confirm using **35**, then select the audio source.

When you connect a USB media source while the audio system is switched on then the source will automatically switch to the new media and start to play its content.

When you connect a Bluetooth® media source while the audio system is on, if the audio source playing was already Bluetooth® then the media content will switch and start to play automatically on the audio system.

Note: press **28** to display the telephone menu.



VOLUME

Adjust the volume by pressing **27** or **29**. Briefly press **27** to increase the volume by one notch.

The display shows "Speed", followed by the current setting.

Mute

Briefly press 28 to mute the sound.

Briefly press **27**, **28** or **29** again to resume playing the current audio source.

USING VOICE RECOGNITION

Voice recognition system

The audio system can be used to operate voice recognition via your smartphone (if compatible). This makes it possible to control the functions of your smartphone by voice, while keeping your hands on the steering wheel.

Note:

- your smartphone's voice recognition system only enables you to use the functions provided with your smartphone. It does not enable you to interact with the other audio system functions, such as the radio etc.
- when using voice recognition, the audio system will use the language set on your smartphone;
- if you try to use your vehicle's voice recognition system with a paired smartphone that is not equipped with voice recognition, a message will be displayed on the audio system screen to notify you.



Using voice recognition with your phone

Activation

To activate the voice recognition system, you must:

- get a 3G, 4G or Wifi connection with your smartphone;
- activate the Bluetooth® feature on your smartphone and make it visible to other devices (please refer to your smartphone user manual for instructions);



- pair and connect your smartphone to the audio system (please refer to the section on "Pairing, unpairing a telephone");
- briefly press 20 or 31 (depending on the vehicle) to activate the function, then speak (a beep indicates that voice recognition is activated).

Deactivation

Press **20** or **31** again (depending on the vehicle).

An audible signal indicates that voice recognition is deactivated.

LISTENING TO THE RADIO (1/7)

Radio with central display

Select a radio band

Select the desired band from FM, AM or DR (terrestrial digital radio):

- by repeatedly pressing 6.
- by repeatedly pressing 13 or 14, then confirm by pressing 18.

Selecting a radio station

This mode allows you to search for stations manually, scrolling through the frequencies by rotating **6** or **15**.



Storage of radio stations

This operating mode allows you to listen to your pre-set radio stations.

Select a band (FM, DR, AM), then select a radio station using the modes described above.

To store a station, press and hold **9** until you hear a sound signal.

You can save up to six stations per waveband.

To recall a stored station, briefly press 9.

You can see the list of stations in "Favourites" at the top of the list of stations. To return to the list of stations, use 4 or press and hold 6.

Selecting a radio station

Select the desired waveband (FM, DR or AM) by pressing **2** repeatedly.

This list can include up to 100 radio stations having the strongest frequencies in your area.

Rotate **6** or **15** to scroll through the radio stations in the FM/DR list.

LISTENING TO THE RADIO (2/7)

Display radio text

To display the "Radio text", briefly press on **5**.

If no information is provided, the message "No message" is displayed on the screen.





"Radio text" text information (FM)

Some FM radio stations broadcast text information related to the program playing (e.g. the title of a song, artist name etc.). Press **5** to scroll through the "Radio text".

Note: this information is only available on some radio stations. Use **6** or **15** to scroll through the information according to the display style.

Information and news "Radio text" (DR)

This feature allows access to text information recorded on some radio stations. You can scroll through the text to display new updates on (economy, politics, health, weather, sports etc.) using 6 or 15.

Press **5** again to return to the radio station currently playing.

Radio settings

Display the settings menu by briefly pressing **5**, then select "Radio settings" using **15** or **6**, then press **6** to confirm. The available functions are as follows:

– "AF";

- "DR Interrupt...";
- "Update FM List";
- "Update DR List".

"**TA**"

When this feature is activated, your audio system searches for and automatically plays traffic bulletins as new reports are broadcast by some "FM" or "DR" radio stations.

Note: This feature is not available for the AM waveband.

Select the "Traffic information" function then, if needed, select another audio source.

Traffic information is broadcast automatically and has priority over the source being listened to at the time.

To activate or deactivate this feature, refer to the "Radio settings" paragraph under "System settings".

"**AF**"

The frequency of an FM station changes according to the geographical area. Some stations use the RDS system, mainly for automatic retuning of the AF frequency during car trips.

DR program guide

This feature enables your audio system to display the station's upcoming programs for the day.

Note: This information is only available for the selected station's next three time slots.

LISTENING TO THE RADIO (4/7)

"DR Interrupt..." (newscasts)

When this function is activated, it is possible to automatically listen to news as it is broadcast by certain «FM» or «DR» radio stations.

If you select other sources, when a new broadcast of the selected bulletin type is made, it will interrupt the other sources.

To activate or deactivate this function, please refer to the information on "DR Interrupt..." in the "System settings" section.

"Update the FM list"

This feature allows you to perform an update of all FM stations in the area where you are located.

- Display the settings menu by briefly pressing 5, select "Radio" by rotating 6, then press 6 to confirm;
- select "Update FM List" by rotating 6, then press 6 to confirm.

Automatic updating of the FM stations in the area will then begin. The message "Update FM List" is displayed on the instrument panel.

When the update is finished, the message "FM list updated" is displayed on the screen.

Note:

- if another source is selected, the FM radio list update runs in the background;
- you can also update the DR and FM radio list by pressing and holding 2.

"Updating the DR list"

Use this function to update all DR stations in the area where you are located:

- display the settings menu by briefly pressing 5, select "Radio" by rotating 6, then press 6 to confirm;
- select "Update DR List" by rotating 6, then press 6 to confirm.

Automatic updating of the list of terrestrial digital radio stations in your area begins. The message "Update DR List" is displayed on the instrument panel.

When the automatic frequency scan is finished, the message "DR list updated" is displayed on the instrument panel.

Note: you can update the DR radio list by pressing and holding **2**.

LISTENING TO THE RADIO (5/7)

Radio with display on the instrument panel

Select a radio band

To select the desired band from FM, AM or DR (terrestrial digital radio), press **32** to access the "Radio" menu then select the desired waveband using **33** or **34** and confirm with **35**.

Selecting a radio station

There are several different ways to select and search for a radio station:

- "list mode";
- "manual mode".

"List mode"

Perform an automatic scan to search for stations using **33** or **34**.

The radio station you stop at in the list will automatically play shortly afterwards.

To return to the list of stations, use **36** or browse with **26**, **33** or **34**.

To get the most recent list of stations, update the radio list.



For more information on this action, please refer to the information on "Updating FM list" and "Updating DR list" in this section.

"Manual mode"

This mode enables you to search for stations manually by scrolling through the frequencies."Manual mode"

This mode enables you to search for stations manually by scrolling through the frequencies.

LISTENING TO THE RADIO (6/7)



Details

This function displays the information on the frequency that you wish to see on the screen (see above). It is displayed automatically after a moment or by pressing **35**.

Storage of radio stations

This operating mode allows you to listen to your pre-set radio stations.

Select a band (FM, DR), then select a radio station using the modes described above.

To store a station, press and hold **35** until you hear a sound signal.

You can see your list of six stations in "Favourites" at the top of the list of stations.

The radio station you stop at will automatically play shortly afterwards. To return to the list of stations, use **36**, or browse with **26**, **33** or **34**.

Selecting a station

Select the desired band (FM, DR or AM) by pressing **24** or **25** repeatedly.

This list can include up to 100 radio stations with the strongest frequencies in the area where you are located.

Use **26**, **33** or **34** to scroll through the radio stations in the FM, DR list.

LISTENING TO THE RADIO (7/7)



Radio settings

Display the settings menu by briefly pressing on **32**, select "Set Time", then "Audio settings" using **33** or **34**. Press **35** to confirm.

The available functions are as follows:

– "Update FM List";

- "Update DR List".

"Updating the FM list"

This feature allows you to perform an update of all FM stations in the area where you are located.

From the "Radio settings" menu, select "Update FM List" using **33** or **34**, then press **35** to confirm.

Automatic updating of the FM stations in the area will begin. The message "Update FM List" is displayed on the instrument panel.

Once the update is finished, the message "FM list updated" is displayed on the screen.

"Updating the DR list"

This feature allows you to perform an update of all DR stations in the area where you are located.

From the "Radio settings" menu, select "Update DR List" using **33** or **34**, then press **35** to confirm.

Automatic updating of the DR stations in the area will begin. The message "Update DR List" is displayed on the instrument panel.

Once the update is finished, the message "DR list updated" is displayed on the screen.

Note: if another source is selected using **24** or **25**, the FM or DR radio list update will run in the background.

AUXILIARY AUDIO SOURCES (1/8)

Radio with central display

Your audio system is equipped with a USB port as well as a Bluetooth® connection which can be used to connect external audio sources.

Note: the auxiliary audio source formats include MP3,WMA and AAC.

USB connection

Connection

Connect the plug of the MP3 player, portable digital audio player or USB drive to the USB port.

Once the device is connected, the track will be displayed automatically.

Using the external audio source

Once your external audio source is connected, its contents can be accessed via the multimedia system menus. Once the external audio source is connected, the first audio track will start to play automatically.

The system automatically restarts the last song played if the external audio player was previously connected to the audio system.

The audio system stores playlists identical to those of your external audio source.

If the external audio source has files, playlists and folders in its directory, the display and playback order on the **10** screen will be as follows:

- "Folders";
- "Tracks";
- "Playlists".

To access the contents of your external audio player via your audio system:

- press 6 to return to the playlist;
- rotate 6 or 15 to scroll through the tracks;

press 4 to go back to the previous folder;

or

 press 6 to select the folder, playlist or listen to the selected track.

Charging using the USB port

Once the USB plug of your portable digital audio player or telephone is connected to the USB **7** port of the audio system, it is possible to charge and maintain the charging level of the battery during use.

Note: some devices do not recharge or maintain battery charge level when they are connected to the USB port on the audio system.

AUXILIARY AUDIO SOURCES (2/8)

Bluetooth® audio playback

In order to use your Bluetooth® portable digital audio device, you must pair it to the vehicle upon first use. Please refer to the information on the "Bluetooth® function" in the "General description" section.

Pairing enables the audio system to recognise and store a Bluetooth® portable digital audio device.

Note:

- if your Bluetooth® portable digital audio device is equipped with *b* telephone functions and *a* audio player functions, pairing one of the functions will automatically involve pairing of the other;
- the number of functions which can be accessed depends on the type of portable digital audio player and its compatibility with the audio system.



Connect

Your portable digital audio device must be connected via Bluetooth® *c* or USB to the audio system in order to access all of its features.



Only handle the personal stereo when traffic conditions permit.

Store the portable audio player safely while driving (risk of being thrown in the event of sudden braking or impact). For a device already paired, perform the following steps:

- enable the portable digital audio player Bluetooth® connection and make it visible to other devices (for more information please see the user manual of your portable digital audio player);
- select the Bluetooth® audio source by pressing 2, 13 or 14, then confirm your choice by pressing 6 or 18.

Use

Your portable digital audio player must be connected to the audio system to enable access to all of its features.

Note: the portable digital audio player cannot be connected to the audio system unless it has been paired.

Once the Bluetooth® portable digital audio player is connected, you can operate it via your audio system.

Once the external audio source is connected, the first audio track will start to play automatically. The "PLAY" symbol **d** is displayed.

Rotate **6** or **15** to go to the previous track or the next track.

Press **16** and **17** simultaneously to "MUTE" **f** the audio track (press again to resume playback).

Note:

- In some cases, you may need to refer to your device's user manual to finalise the connection procedure;
- The number of accessible functions varies depending on the type of portable player and its compatibility with the audio system.

Shuffle MIX

Press **12** or press and hold **18** to shuffle all the tracks in the folder.

The MIX symbol **e** appears on the screen. A track is then selected at random. The transition from one track to another takes place randomly.

Press again on **12** or press and hold **18** to deactivate the shuffle. The "MIX" symbol **e** will disappear.

Turning off the audio system deactivates the shuffle function.

Note:

- on a Bluetooth® device connected to the audio system, the shuffle function will be applied to the folder in playback. Change to another folder to apply the shuffle function to that one;
- if the shuffle function is activated, enabling the repeat function will deactivate it.

AUXILIARY AUDIO SOURCES (4/8)



Repeat «RPT»

This feature allows you to repeat a track.

Press **2** or briefly press **18** to activate the repeat function.

The RPT symbol **g** appears on the screen.

Press **2** again or briefly press **18** to deactivate the repeat function, the "RPT" indicator light **g** disappears.

Note: if the shuffle function is activated, enabling the repeat function will deactivate it. The MIX symbol **e** will go out and the RPT symbol **g** will come on.



You can activate the "RPT" and "MIX" functions simultaneously. The *j* symbol appears on the screen.

Play mode

The playback mode is shown by the following symbols:

- "PLAY" d;
- "MUTE" *f*;
- "STOP" h.

Pause

Press **16** and **17** simultaneously to mute the sound or pause the audio track. The **f** symbol appears on the screen.

Press 16 and 17 simultaneously to unmute the sound or play the audio track. The *f* symbol disappears from the screen and the *d* symbol appears.

This function is also deactivated if you change the volume or source, or if an automatic news bulletin comes on.

Connect the plug of the MP3 player, portable digital audio player or USB drive to the USB port.

Once the device is connected, the track will be displayed automatically.

Use

Once the external audio source is connected, the first audio track will start to play automatically. The audio system automatically restarts the last track played if the external audio player was previously connected to the audio system.

Once your external audio source is connected, its contents can be accessed via the multimedia system menus.

It stores playlists identical to those of your external audio source.

If the external audio source has files, playlists and folders in its directory, the display and playback order on the **22** part of the instrument panel screen will be as follows:

- Folders;
- Tracks;
- Playlists.

To access the contents of your external audio player via your audio system:

- press 36 to return to the playlist;

or

 rotate 26 or press 33 or 34 to scroll through the tracks. then:

press **36** to go back to the previous folder;

or

 press **35** to select the folder, playlist or listen to the selected track.

Charging using the USB port

Once the USB plug of your portable digital audio player or telephone is connected to the USB port of your audio system (located near the driver's position in the passenger compartment) it will be possible to charge or maintain the battery level during use.

Note: some devices do not recharge or maintain battery charge level when they are connected to the USB port on the audio system.

AUXILIARY AUDIO SOURCES (6/8)

Bluetooth® audio playback

In order to use your Bluetooth® portable digital audio device, you must pair it to the vehicle upon first use. Please refer to the information on the "Bluetooth® function" in the "General description" section.

Pairing enables the audio system to recognise and store a Bluetooth® portable digital audio device.

Note:

- if your Bluetooth® digital device is equipped with telephone and portable digital audio player functions, pairing one of these functions will automatically pair the other;
- the number of functions which can be accessed depends on the type of portable digital audio player and its compatibility with the audio system.



Connecting to the vehicle

Your portable digital audio device must be connected via Bluetooth® m or USB n to the audio system in order to access all of its features.

Store the portable audio player safely while driving (risk of being thrown in the event of sudden braking or impact). For a device already paired, perform the following steps:

- activate the Bluetooth® connection on the *k* system;
- enable the telephone or portable digital audio device Bluetooth® connection and make it visible to other devices (for more information please see the user manual of your device);
- select the audio source Bluetooth® by repeatedly pressing 24 or 25, then confirm by pressing 35 or 30;

WIRELESS CHARGER (1/2)



Introduction

Use the induction charging zone **1** to charge a telephone without a cable.

Note: for more information on compatible telephones, contact an authorised dealer or visit the manufacturer's website.



Charging procedure

Position your telephone in the **2** induction area **1**.

Phone charging **2** is interrupted in the following cases:

- an object is detected in the 1 induction charging area, as indicated by the charging status 5. A message will ask you to clear the wireless charging placement area so that only your telephone is present;
- the telephone is fully charged, as indicated by the charging status 3;

Objects left in the induction charging area **1** may overheat. You are advised to place them in the areas provided for this purpose (storage compartment, sun visor compartment etc.).

Charging progress

Progress of the charging is shown on the audio system front panel:

- telephone charged 3;
- charging in progress 4;
- metallic object detected 5.



Note: it is preferable to remove any protective bodyshell or case from your telephone in order to ensure optimal charging.

The inductive charger uses open source software under a BSD-3-Clause licence, subject to restrictions and limitations which you should inform yourself of by consulting Open Source Initiative.

It is essential not to leave any objects (USB drive, SD card, credit card, jewellery, keys, coins etc.) in the induction charging area **1** whilst charging your telephone. Remove all magnetic cards or credit cards from the case before positioning your telephone in the induction charging area **1**.
